

Frisco Downtown Mural Project

Frisco Arts is now accepting submissions for a Mural in a community setting located in the Rail District of Historical Downtown Frisco. The **Frisco Downtown Mural Project** is funded by Noon Rotary of Frisco, Texas, and administered by Frisco Association for the Arts.

Eligibility:

Artists eligible for this project include: Students enrolled in a college art program at a degree granting institution, Professional Artists, curators, neighborhood associations, and citizen-based groups, and must be 21 years of age or older, currently residing in North Texas. Artists may only be involved or listed in one submission, whether it is individual or a group submission. Submitting more than one will result in disqualification (denial) of all associated submissions.

Submission Fees:

There is no submission fee for proposals.

Concept:

Artists must submit a written proposal, no more than 500 words, detailing the idea and process of a hand-painted mural, listing anyone who may be involved in the creation of the art. A sketch representing the completed mural, 5 examples of artwork (300 dpi jpeg labeled with artists last name and numbered 1-5), and an artist resume should be included in submission.

Preference will be given to innovative projects that address the concept of community. Competitive proposals will identify the "Frisco: Past and Present" concept relating to the community plans to work with and the methods they will use to reach and include that audience.

Artist Responsibilities:

Artists are responsible for the gathering or acquisitions of all art media and equipment needed. Transportation to the site during the installation/creation process. Frisco Arts is not responsible for insurance of the artwork or artist during the project.

Mural must be created of an approved, durable material, suitable for exteriors and weather resistant, with a sealant applied after the artwork is dried, provided by the artist. All media must be listed in the artist proposals and should pose no serious threat to public safety, nor should it obscure view with excessive projections of materials. The structural integrity of the building may not be disturbed in any way for the creation of this artwork.

Artwork must be created on-site, directly onto the assigned surface, and may not be a removable or pre-printed, pre-painted, or adhered medium. Please verify the scale of the artwork to ensure public visibility.

Artworks must be original and created by the artist, and not in violation of copyright issues.

Artwork may not contain nudity, violence, or questionable content, and should not feature logos or signage. The artwork may not be promotional of businesses or corporations. The mural must be family-friendly.

The artist will be invited to sign the artwork in a designated area on artwork after completion and approval by the Mural Committee.

Agreements:

Artist must agree to respectfully attend the planned reception or ribbon-cutting ceremony related to this project.

If chosen for this award, artwork created must reflect the artwork and concept submitted.

All promotional information regarding this project must be initiated and handled by Frisco Arts; Frisco Arts has the right to use photographic reproductions of the artwork or event for future promotional purposes. The grant total is for the entire project, regardless of the number of creators you include, is \$2500. Artist will be paid ½ of the grant award upfront. There will be reimbursement of art materials and media of up to \$1000 to be paid after receipts/invoices have been submitted. This is a competitive grant process for Frisco-based artists of all disciplines. By accepting funds, artist agrees to all requirements on this prospectus.

An invoice for Artists Fees (Award amount) and Art Supply receipts for the Project must be delivered to Frisco Arts by the artist/designer no later than one week after projected completion date to received full funding.

Submission Process:

Proposals must be submitted no later than 5:00pm on October 19, 2018 for full consideration. All proposals are reviewed by the Downtown Mural Committee, whose members include artists, arts advocates and other creative professionals. **All project submissions must be received through the application process as indicated above, with document “Frisco Downtown Mural Artist Application” attached.**

Due to public response, we cannot contact all applicants or explain artworks that were not selected as the awardees.

Grant Awardees will be contacted by October 30, 2018 via email and/or phone call.
